

Remove DRM from iTunes Rentals to Keep on iPhone 6 Plus Permanently



As the iPhone 6 and iPhone 6 Plus are now beginning to hit the store shelves, iPhone users can hardly wait to upgrade their old iPhone to the new models for the stunning features introduced by iPhone 6. According to the official description we can see that asides from the obvious change on a bigger size - 4.7 inches for iPhone 6 and 5.5 inches for iPhone 6 Plus, some other major improvements including thinner design, more powerful A8 chip, Retina HD display, new phase detection camera, 20% faster CPU, longer battery life, and 128 larger storage, have made the iPhone 6 and iPhone 6 Plus the ever best Apple phones that are worth buying.

Because of the newly added Retina HD display on iPhone 6 and the Plus, there would probably be more people to watch movies on iPhone once they get the devices. And as iTunes being the default online movie service for iPhone, most people will prefer to rent or purchase movies from iTunes for their iPhone 6 or iPhone 6 Plus. It would be fine for the purchased iTunes movies. However, problems occur when it comes to movies rented from iTunes. Due to the DRM protection, iTunes rentals come with expiration limit which allows users to keep the rental in 30 days only and forces them to finish watching the movie within 24 hours once started. That's to say, if you rent a movie from iTunes on iPhone 6 or




iPhone 6 Plus, it will disappear from your iPhone 6 once expired. So is there any way to unlock the restriction and keep iTunes rentals on iPhone 6 forever?

To <u>unlock the 24-hour time limit from iTunes rentals</u> and keep the movies on iPhone 6 or Plus permanently, the most important thing is to remove DRM protection from iTunes rentals. Guide: Remove DRM & Keep iTunes Rented Movies on iPhone 6 Forever

Step 1 Add Protected iTunes Rental Movies

After launch iTunes to iPhone 6 DRM Video Converter for Mac, click "**Add Files**" button to select rented movies you want to convert to iPhone 6 or iPhone 6 Plus from the drop-down iTunes library. Click "**OK**" to load the rentals to the converter.

Step 2 Adjust Output Settings

Once the iTunes movie rentals imported to the program, select the output audio tracks and subtitles by clicking the "**Settings**" icon listed behind the movie name.

Step 3 Remove DRM and Convert iTunes Rentals to MP4

Click "**Convert**" to begin to remove DRM from iTunes movie rentals and convert the files to unprotected MP4 format for iPhone 6 or iPhone 6 Plus.

After iTunes to iPhone 6 conversion, you can simply copy the converted DRM-free iTunes movies to keep on iPhone 6 for as long as you wish.
